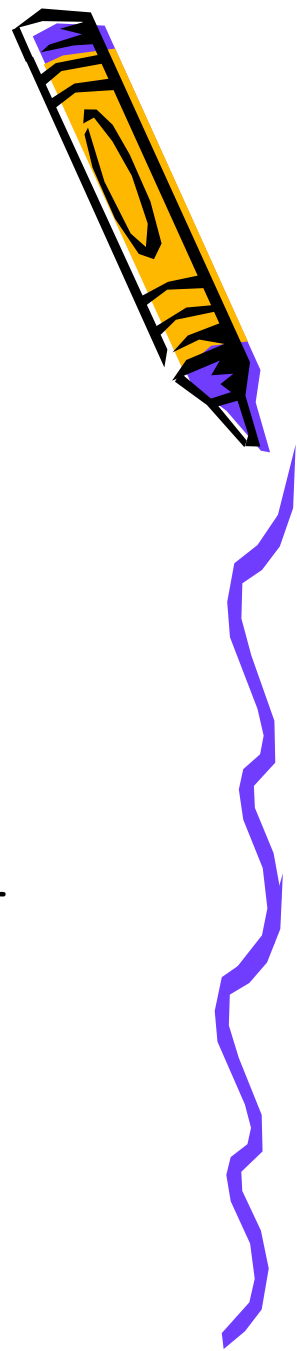


Times of day

- **Nursery** - 8.45 a.m. - 11.45am
& 12:15 p.m. - 3:15 p.m.
- **Reception** - 8.45 a.m. - 3.20pm

Foundation Stage doors will be opened at the start of the day at 8.40 a.m. and at 3.10 p.m. at the end of the school day.

This is to ease congestion at the start and end of the day.



EYFS curriculum

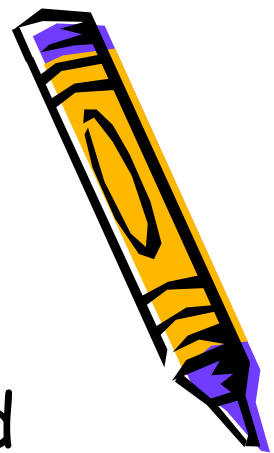

Foundation Stage

- The children learn through a play-based curriculum which is planned and organised to provide a range of learning experiences.
- Reception and Nursery follow the same curriculum and will occasionally plan activities and events together.
- Continuity and progression is very important.
- Records are passed up from Nursery to Reception.

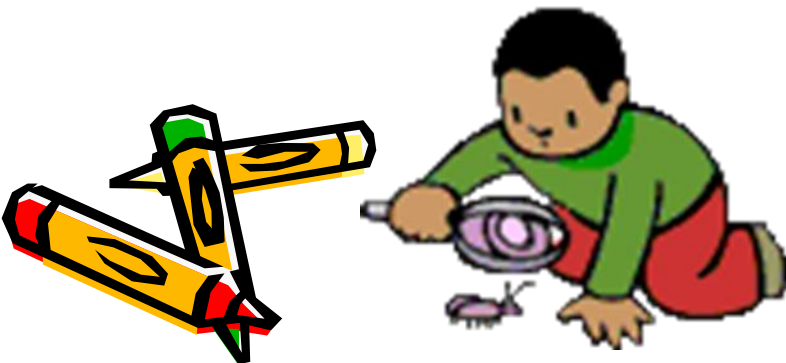

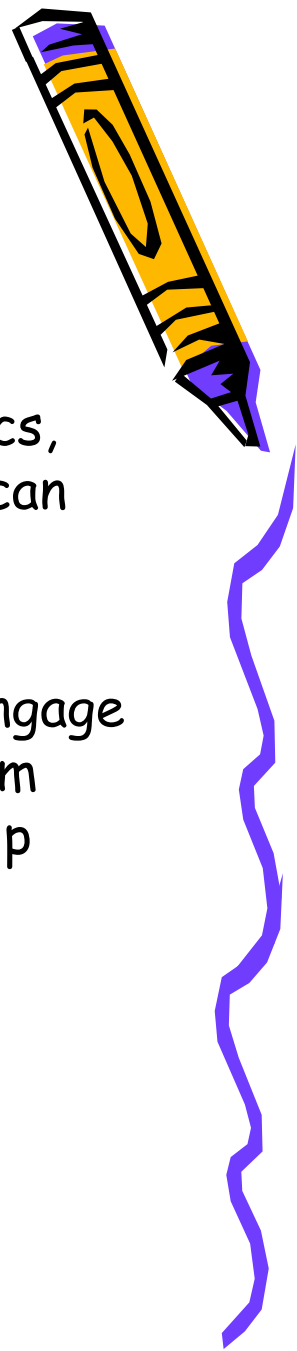

Learning in the Foundation Stage

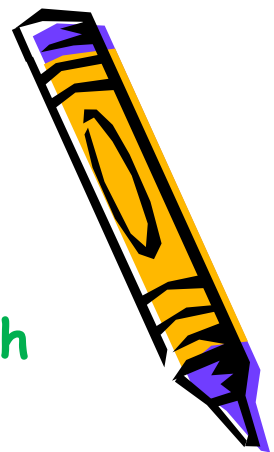
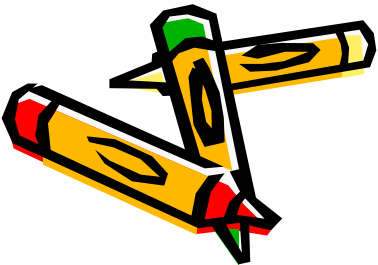


- Adult led learning - we plan specific learning, e.g. phonics, number work. This gives the children skills which they can transfer into their own learning.
- Child initiated learning - the children choose what to engage in, but we as staff scaffold their learning by giving them the resources they need, support their learning and help them to move on in their learning. This way of learning follows more closely the children's interests.

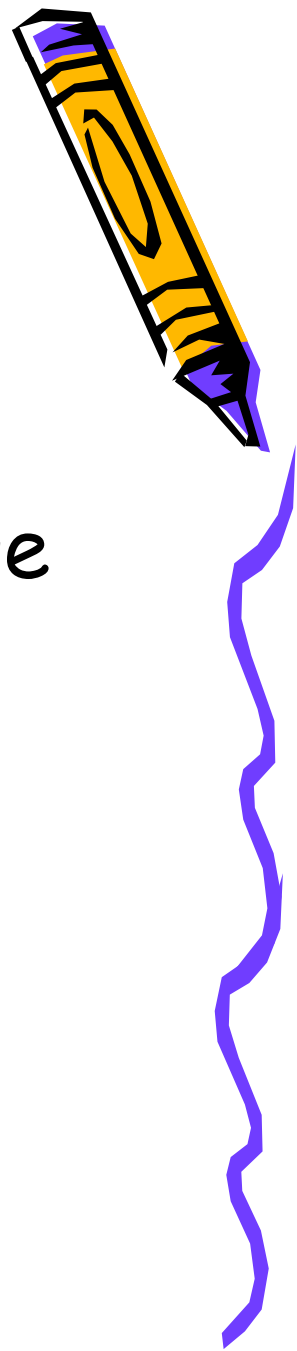


Reading

- Nursery children will choose and bring a book home each week to share.
- Reception children will receive a reading bag which is kindly provided by the PTA. This will initially contain a picture only book. They will also receive a word card with key words on. Please send these in every day.
- It is VERY important to hear your child read daily at home.



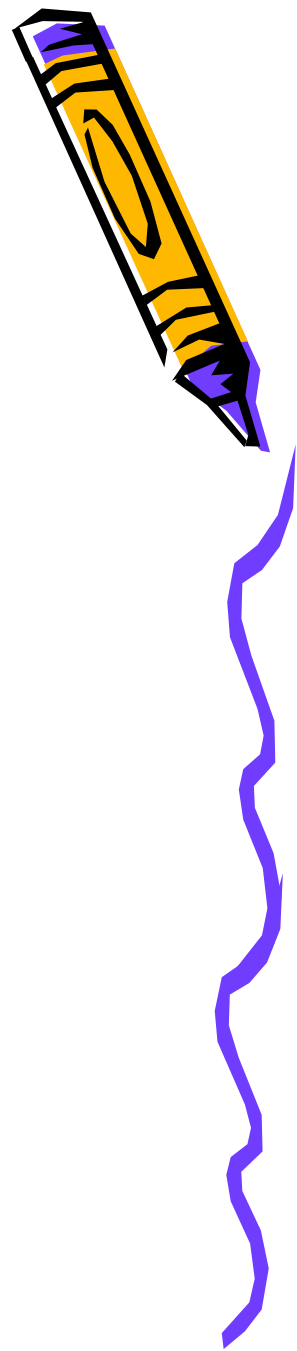
Assessment in the EYFS



- We assess using the new EYFS curriculum guidelines within the age bands -
 - Birth to 3
 - 3 - 4 years
 - Children in Reception



Reception children are assessed as soon as they start school using the statutory government baseline. We then also use a secure online 'Learning Journey' called Sonar to track children's progress and record their achievements.



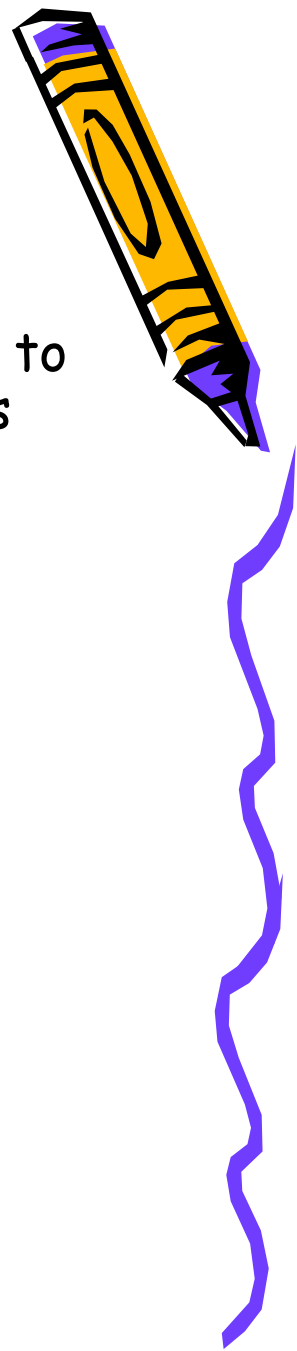

We've chosen Arbor to help us manage our school.

Arbor is a simple, smart and cloud-based MIS (Management Information System), which helps us work faster, smarter and more collaboratively as a school. The Arbor App and Parent Portal mean we can keep you informed about your child's life at school in a much more accessible way. Log into Arbor to see and update your child's information, get live updates and make payments or bookings on the go.

The Parent Portal works on Google Chrome (computer or laptop) and you can download the Arbor App from the App Store or Google Play Store on your phone (Android 5.0, IOS 10.0 and upwards).

How to get started

1. Wait for your welcome email from us telling you Arbor is ready - you won't be able to log in before
2. Click the link in your welcome email to set up your password
3. Go to the App or Google Play Store on your phone and search 'Arbor'
4. Click 'install' on Android or 'Get' on iPhone then open the App
5. Enter your email, select the school, then enter your password
6. Accept the Terms & Conditions and enter your child's birthday

Need help using Arbor?

Contact the school office if you have questions about Arbor, the App or Parent Portal. Tell us the type and model of your phone, e.g. an iPhone SE, and include screenshots or screen recordings.

To safeguard student data in line with General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR), Arbor only works directly with schools.

Some tips to try:

1. Ensure your username is the email address you use for Arbor. Ask us to **check the email address** linked to your account.
2. **Reset your password** from the login page, or ask us to do this.
3. If the login email was sent to you more than 96 hours ago, the **password link will have expired**. Ask us to send it again.
4. Ask the school office to check that your email address has not been used twice - e.g. on another guardian or child's profile.
5. **Enter the birthday** of one of your children to log in.
6. Only relatives who are **Primary Guardians** of a child can access the Arbor App. Ask us to check you can access Arbor.

School Dinners

- All Reception children are entitled to a free school dinner, but you can still choose for your child to bring a packed lunch. The office / kitchen need a weeks notice if you want to change from either one.



Extra funding

- Previously parents in receipt of benefits would have been entitled to free school meals, this automatically meant that your child was entitled to extra support in school. Now we have no way of knowing which children are entitled to extra support unless parents fill in a form from the office. This form is kept in strictest confidence.



Each day the children will be offered milk, water, fruit and /or another snack.

The children do not need water bottles.

To be paid at the beginning of each half term.

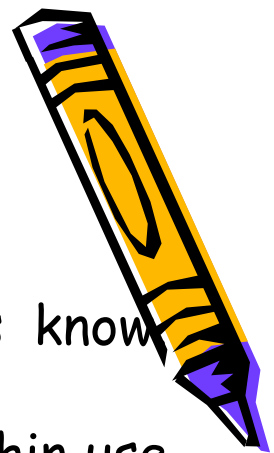
Occasionally money from the snack fund will be used to enhance an area/topic.

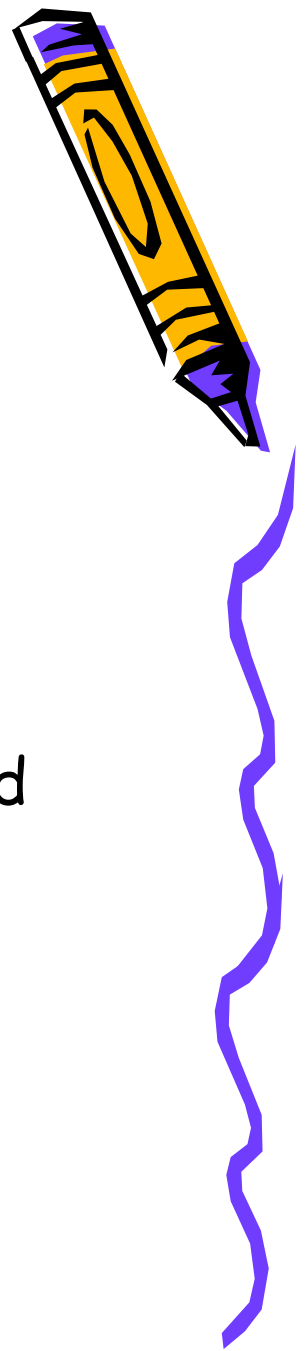
If your child has had vomiting or diarrhoea, they must not

Uniform

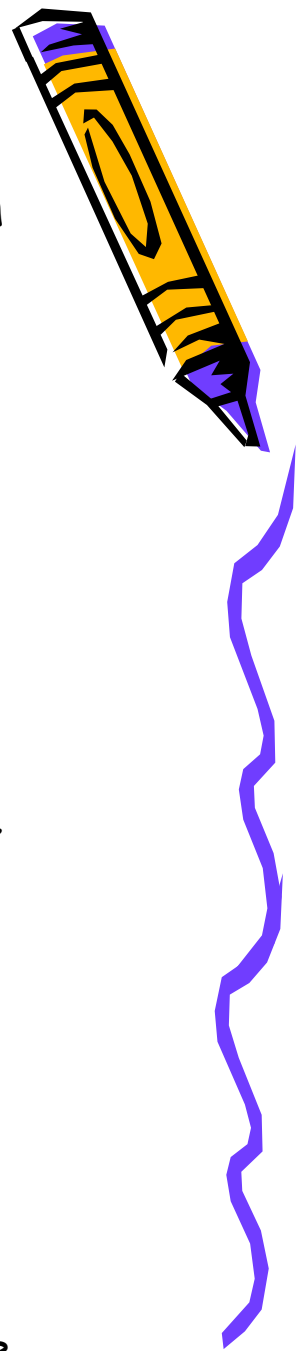


- Reception children wear a jade green sweatshirt/cardigan to match the rest of the school.

Nursery children can wear a red jumper or cardigan, white polo t-shirt with jogging pants, a skirt or pinafore.

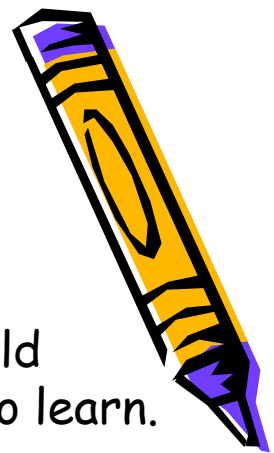

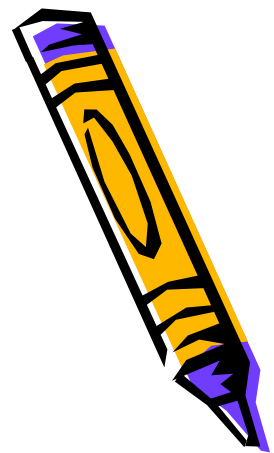


Absence / Lateness

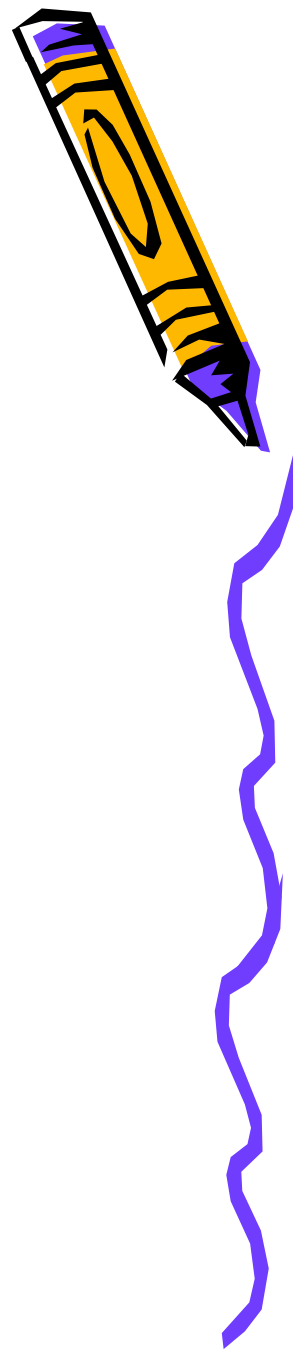

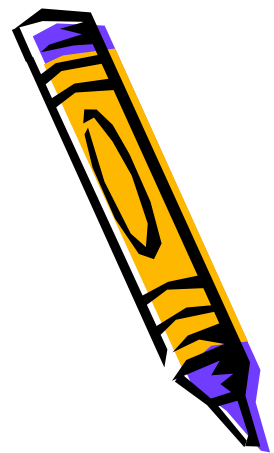
